And most importantly, Ridge is home to a huge stable of stellar Zinfandels, always beautifully balanced and well proportioned. The other nice thing about these Ridge wines is their availability. They generally make enough of them that you can find them in stores or online.

• 2015 Ridge Chardonnay Estate, \$55

In search of full disclosure, Ridge has stated listing all ingredients in its wine on the back label. This includes "malolactic bacteria" which in this wine is definitely a good thing. These little critters are what turn a sharp, acidic, tart, lemony wine into something a little kinder and gentler. Things can go too far in that direction though too. The trick in making great Chardonnay is to find the sweet spot in the middle between tart and creamy. The 2015 Estate Chardonnay has found it.

• 2015 Ridge Geyserville, \$40

This year Ridge is celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Geyserville bottling. Along with Lytton Springs, this is perennially my favorite Ridge Zinfandel. The label does not say "Zinfandel" because at 70% it falls below the 75% threshold for the name to be on the label. The wine's complexity is increased by the addition of Carignane, Petite Sirah and Alicante Bouchet. A mix of ripe, zesty, flashy blackberry fruit with an underlying sense of elegance and grace, this well balanced, medium bodied wine is a luscious crowd-pleaser. Try with winter stews or braised lamb shanks.

• 2015 Ridge Zinfandel East Bench, \$32

This 100% Zin comes from

the Dry Creek Valley in Sonoma County. This wine has a bright berry nose, medium body with good acid to give it balance. A very food-friendly style of Zinfandel. Try it with grilled steaks or chops.

• 2013 Ridge Zinfandel Paso Robles, \$35

Hailing from the old Benito Dusi Ranch, this is an excellent example of the "Paso Robles style" of Zin. Wines from this area generally have a riper, richer, late harvest quality than wines grown farther north in Sonoma and Napa. While the wine shows plenty of luscious, opulent fruit, it still retains the acid and structure to keep it from being overpowering.

• 2012 Ridge Cabernet Sauvignon Estate, \$60

This wine is the "baby Montebello" from the famed vineyard overlooking Silicon Valley. It is blended with 14% Merlot, 6% Petite Verdot and 5% Cabernet Franc. The wine itself possesses a deep plum color as well as a sweet perfume of minerals, and cassis, medium to full body, excellent texture, ripe tannin and enough structure for aging up to 15 years.

• 2012 Ridge Merlot Estate, \$55

Ridge is not as well known for its Merlot as for its Zins and Cabernets, so I was interested to see what they would do with this grape. This wine is softer and more velvety than Cabernet, with a complex nose of mint, earth and spice with layers of blackberry and cassis fruit on the palate supported by ample structure and a long compelling finish.
