## What is IWCA?

IWCA is a working group with a mission to take collective

action to decarbonize the global wine industry, underscored with goals for member wineries to achieve a 50 percent reduction in carbon emissions by 2030 and become Climate Positive by 2050 for Scopes 1-3. IWCA is open to wineries who recognize that climate change is the most significant threat to the wine community and are guided by the urgency for strategic action to accelerate innovative solutions. In 2019, IWCA received the Wine Enthusiast Visionary Star Award for its leadership in galvanizing collaborative climate action across the wine industry.

On the Lytton Springs winery's south-facing roof, almost 400 photovoltaic panels supply 75% of the winery's electricity needs over the course of a year. The winery itself is constructed of straw hay bales creating a highly insulated
